We cover different topics during our programmes including health subjects like: blood disorders, cancer, contraception and family planning, digestive disorders, family support, genetic disorders, infections, medicines, mental health, operations, pregnancy and breastfeeding and sexual health.

We also take calls from our listeners and answer their questions on air. I believe that my colleagues and I are doing this for the benefit of our community in Bristol.

I present the "Well-Being" show every Monday from 12 till 2. My show evolved from a slot on Phil's lunchtime show right at the beginning of the broadcasting of BCFM, back in March. I was pretty terrified that first day, even though I was halfway through my B Tech radio journalism course, at the City of Bristol College in College Green! But Phil is such a 'pro', he soon put me at ease, and I started to really enjoy my slot, and eventually gained the confidence to do my own show. Encounters Film Festival 2007



Hi, I'm Mark Le Leivre

I present 'The Movies and Music Programme' on BCfm on a Saturday afternoon 1 till 2pm. On the 18th of November I attended the Morph Birthday Party at the Watershed in Bristol. Peter Lord the creator of Morph was interviewed by well known TV personality Phil Jupitus.

For people who don't know "Morph" is a plastacine character of a little man who appeared on a 70's children's programme called Vision On. From that little plastacine man the world famous four time Oscar winner's Ardman Animation grew.

The event was organised by Sue Lion and the Encounters team. A full house listened to Phil as he managed to get some secrets out of Peter Lord of what it was like in the early days of stop frame animation, which Peter Lord and David Sproxten pioneered.

This event was a curtain raiser for the [13th Encounter's International Short Film Festival](#) held at The Watershed. From wed 21st till Sun 25th of November, Bristol was treated to over 1700 short films from over 66 different countries. Screenings included many live films as well as a huge selection of some of the world's best animation shorts and features such as "Persepolis" which was directed by Marjane Satrapi and Vincent Paronnaud and told the story of a young Iranian girl growing up through the overthrow of The Shar of Iran in the Seventies, and her coming of age during the beginning's of fundamentalism and radicalisation of her country.

I was at the Festival as BCfm's man on the spot to bring my listeners reports and recording's of all the big events, as well as to mingle with world class directors such as Richard Eyre who was also recently the executive producer of "Atonement" starring Keira Knightly.

Over the coming weeks I am looking forward to bringing you all the highlights of one of Bristol's most prestigious film festivals. As well as detail's of all the winners of awards in the in the thirteen different categories of film making.

Last month John Curran was lucky enough to interview Tony Benn when he came to Bristol to promote the latest volume of his diaries. The interview went out on his Friday afternoon show, Drivetime which is presented with Dean Blake. Here's what John had to say about his meeting with the renowned politician

So, John, How did this interview come about? Where and when did you meet with Tony Benn?
I interviewed him at St Georges just before he gave the talk.

It was all connected to the publication of the 8th volume of his dairies so he's been touring the country doing these talks. He talked for about 25 minutes and there were questions and answers for about an hour. It was really lively.

Have you read the book?

I've read snatches of it. It's not easy to read a diary from beginning to end

How did you find his persona?

He's a real gentleman, so easy to speak to, a lovely man. He was so encouraging and kind. Of course he's very fluent so it was a very easy interview, you just had to ask him a question and he was off. It was very good. I enjoyed it thoroughly. Quite the most important person I've ever interviewed.

You have done quite a few interviews for your show. Are they usually political?

It mixes. One week I did Tony Benn and the director of the local CAB bcse it was their 30th anniversary, another week I'm did somebody from alcoholics Anonymous and Paul Stevenson who's the first black person to receive the Freedom of the City. .I've done a few of the local cllrs & that gets abit political.

I generally try to do about two (interviews) per show. We maybe put one in the first hour of our show and one in the 2nd half.

Got anything in the pipeline?

Ideas come as they come. Interviews tend to follow up a recent news item.. I'm looking at a few maybe show business people next yr..Willard White, a black opera singer, is coming and Penny Seger, a country & Western Singer. if I could get interviews with them I'd love to.

Would you get them playing music?

I'd try to, although if wiled white sang I think he's blow the studio apart! He's got the most

The BCfm Radio Broadcast Steering Group has a vital role in ensuring that BCfm meets its objective to 'advance the social cohesion of the community by providing an engaging and challenging radio experience to the City of Bristol and to promote the physical, emotional and mental well-being of the diverse communities within'.

The main aims of the Steering Group are to:-

- be aware of the BCfm Broadcast Licence application
- ensure that the Directors of Bristol Community fm Ltd are providing all the necessary facilities to ensure that the aims and objectives of the broadcast can be carried out
- identify groups or individuals in the community that are under-represented in the broadcast industry in Bristol and have not already been identified
- identify areas of progression and wider participation
- attend 80% of steering group meetings
